There will be additional permits asked for at later dates. A motion was made by Commissioner Wolf and seconded by Commissioner Wagner to approve the 24 hour dispensing room permit for May 28, 2016. Building Maintenance Manager Tom Schmeltzer reported to the board that the conference building has very few items left for completion. Discussion was held on a letter being sent regarding rental fees and cleaning deposit fees for the use of the fairgrounds buildings. Discussion was held on the building maintenance budget and the need to transfer funds. A hearing will be held at the May 17 meeting to transfer funds.

Road and Bridge Superintendent Randy Chenoweth reported that the crew has been grading roads. The shooting range roadway will be graded in the near future. Several items to put on an upcoming auction were reviewed. Discussion was held on selling a flat bed trailer that is in need

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of major repairs. The board would like to proceed with a sealed bid on the trailer. Randy reported that he had purchased tires in the amount of \$3,480.00. The board again reminded Randy that all purchases over \$500 must have approval by the board before the purchase not after.

Public Health Nurse Amanda Heinemeyer met with the board to discuss a wellness blood draw for county employees and spouses. The board would like wait and set up the blood draw through the hospital until July after a decision is made on health insurance. Amanda reported that approval has been received from the state to purchase an immunization refrigerator with Bio Terrorism funds in the amount of \$3,375.00. Approval was given by the board to proceed with the purchase.

Planner David Anderson presented the Urban Boundary and Roadway Functional Classification certificate for the chairman signature. David reported that the Big Cottonwood survey work had been completed and he will work on modeling the bridge. David will check with the City of Worland regarding the DEQ permit for the sewer line placement at the fairgrounds.

Youth Alternatives Director Sarah Garcia and Library Director Karen Funk met with the board to discuss the use of \$5,000 in funds that has come available through the Juvenile Justice grant. Approval was given to move forward with receiving the funds and possibly use a portion for the Ten Sleep Learning Center. Funds can be used for any type project that will keep youth out of the juvenile detention.
