Clerk/Treasurer Tracy Glanz reported that Mayor Gill, Councilmember George, Director of Public Works Kruger and herself attended the Washakie County Commissioners meeting today to talk about applying for a planning grant through the Wyoming Business Council to update the Master Plan for the City of Worland as well as for Washakie County and the Town of Ten Sleep. It would be a \$100,000.00 grant with a \$25,000.00 match, split between the entities. The timeline to apply is short as the public hearing would have to be January 7, 2025 and the final application submitted by February 1, 2025.

Chief of Police Gabe Elliott reminded the Council of the Shop with a Cop program this weekend; applications and recommendations are still being accepted. The Parade of Lights is this Saturday at 6:00 p.m. starting at 20th Street and finishing at 5th Street.

City Engineer Representative Mike Donnell informed the Council that Ardurra, the engineer for the Washakie Avenue design, is through the survey and well into design. It was noted that it is important to have a ten (10) foot pathway on the north side from 15th to 8th Street to accommodate pedestrians. The water line to Amish Origins is almost complete, with approximately 200 additional feet of pipe to lay. The as builts for all the recent projects are almost complete.

Mayor Gill thanked all the Department Heads for the work they do.

The Municipal Court Report, Building Permit Summary, Golf Course Financial Report for November 2024 and the minutes for the WCCC for October, 2024 are in the Council packet for review.

There being no further business to come before the Council, Mayor Gill asked for a motion to adjourn.
